M. Scott Taylor is the Canada Research Chair in International, Energy and Environmental Economics at the University of Calgary (Canada). He is also a Research Associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER). His research focuses on the interaction of international markets and environmental outcomes. His contributions include analyses regarding climate change, exploitation of natural resources and growth. In the area of natural resources, he has investigated how property rights regimes affect trade flows, how trading opportunities affect the degree of resource exploitation, and how trade and technology affects the incentives to protect natural resources. His publications have appeared in the American Economic Review (four papers), Quarterly Journal of Economics, Review of Economic Studies, International Economic Review, Journal of International Economics, Journal of Environmental Economics and Management, and Canadian Journal of Economics, among others. His book “International Trade and the Environment: Theory and Evidence” (with Brian Copeland) was published by Princeton University Press in 2003. After the lecture, the speaker will be open for questions. Anyone interested is invited to attend the lecture.

Professor Taylor will teach a Master Course on “International Trade, Resources and the Environment” in the Master of Science (MSc) in Business and Economics at our Faculty from May 4th to May 14th. This course is also recommended for Ph.D. students in international trade and environmental economics. His Visiting Professorship is financed by the Freiwillige Akademische Gesellschaft (FAG).
