The Master in International and Monetary Economics (MIME) is a joint, specialized master's degree offered by the Universities of Basel and Bern.

The program aims at ambitious students who have a strong background in economics and quantitative methods and who are willing to be challenged. You will get equipped with rigorous, state of the art tools in economics, econometrics, and computational economics. These tools can be used in research, policy analysis as well as in pursuing a doctoral degree in economics or a related field. In addition, you will acquire broad and deep expertise in monetary economics and financial markets.

A MIME prepares you for careers in central banks, international institutions, financial regulatory authorities, policy-analysis departments of commercial banks and government agencies dealing with fiscal policy, international economics, and financial markets. It also serves as a springboard for pursuing doctoral studies in Switzerland as well as at top US and European universities.

Unique and perfectly located

The program is unique in Europe as it combines monetary and international economics with financial markets using modern macroeconomic analysis tools. Switzerland is ideally suited to the MIME program and offers excellent job opportunities to MIME graduates as it is home to many international institutions, has a large banking sector, runs independent monetary policy, is a very open economy, and has a wellknown financial regulation agency.

Admission requirements

Students who hold a bachelor's degree obtained at a Swiss university, will be admitted if they meet the following requirements:

- a) Students must demonstrate special knowledge in quantitative methods and in economics. This is done by <u>one</u> of the following two ways:
- A bachelor's degree in economics obtained at a Swiss university with a final grade of at least 5.0 (unrounded).
- 2. Bachelor's degree obtained at a Swiss university in a field of study related to content or methodology of economics with a final grade of at least 5.0 (unrounded) and a GMAT or GRE score in the top 20% of all candidates.
- b) Proof of sufficient English language skills (level B2)

Admission for all other applicants is based on the recommendation of the Governing Board at the request of the Faculty Examination Committee.
